

Counselling Skills

Counselling Skills involve the ability to actively listen to another person to hear and understand what they are trying to say, from their point of view. This portfolio-based course is designed for those who want to learn listening and counselling skills to help others, either in a voluntary or employed capacity, or those who want to find out more about the counselling field. Please note that this course does not qualify you to be a counsellor.

Learning Method

This course is delivered fully in the classroom.

Entry Requirements

All applicants should have a GCSE in English at Grade C/4 or above. If you do not have this qualification, then you may attend a Century English assessment but your score must come out as a Level 2 in order to progress with your application.

Applicants must be able to respect others regardless of race, ethnic origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability. This course involves experiential elements that will require some personal disclosure and associated personal development.

What will I learn?

- Students will develop a range of counselling skills which will involve practicing these with other students in the class.
- Introduction to counselling theories, such as Psychodynamic, Person-Centered, and CBT.
- Identifying own values and beliefs and how this can affect helping relationships.
- How personal and professional support can be used to highlight issues arising from counselling skills practice.
- How to establish boundaries when starting a counselling relationship.
- Key aspects of ethical framework and anti-discriminatory practice.
