
Counselling Studies L3 Certificate



Counselling Studies

This course provides learning experiences which will enable you to develop and practice counselling skills. It will also increase your knowledge/understanding of such skills and look at counselling theories in more depth. It is specifically designed for those who want to take the next step towards training to become a counsellor (having already acquired some counselling skills), or continue their skills development for voluntary work or employment. This level does not qualify you to be a counsellor.

What will I learn?

- Exploring professional conduct, ethical issues, confidentiality, boundaries, and legal responsibility.
- Explore the effects of attitudes and personal value choices brought to the counselling relationship.
- Consider issues relating to valuing difference and diversity in a multi-cultural and diverse society.
- Exploring a range of counselling skills and understanding which counselling skills are used professionally.
- Reflect on counselling theory when working with others and understanding self.
- Using feedback to support development.
- Introduction to casework supervision.

Entry Requirements

All applicants should have a Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills (75 guided learning hours) or equivalent which must have involved tutor assessed skills practice. The course involves experiential learning and self-awareness exercises, which will be demanding of the self in interaction with others, applicants must be prepared and suitably emotionally resourced to undertake this type of training.

Applicants must be able to respect others regardless of race, ethnic origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability.

Funding

This course may be FREE if you...

- Free if you are unemployed, looking for work, and in receipt of an approved benefit.
- Free if you are employed and earning less than £25,000 a year before tax.

If this criteria does not apply to you, then you could either get your employer to sponsor you, pay in four consecutive instalments, or pay the fee in full.

If you are aged 19 or over and thinking about studying a further education - vocational, technical or professional course, you may qualify for an Advanced Learner Loan to help you pay your course fees.
