

Therapeutic Counselling

This part-time qualification gives learners the knowledge, skills and competencies to work as a therapeutic counsellor in an agency context. It is designed to lead to an employed or voluntary role in a counselling agency in both health care and non-medical settings. Learners with sufficient post qualification experience can also begin working as independent practitioners in private practice. The course is delivered one day a week over two years.

This course will be delivered fully in the classroom.

What will I learn?

- Working ethically, safely, and professionally as a counsellor.
- Working within a counselling relationship.
- Working with client diversity in counselling work.
- Working within a user-centred approach to counselling.
- Working with self-awareness in the counselling process.
- Working within a coherent framework of counselling theory and skills.
- Working self-reflectively as a counsellor.

Entry Requirements

Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills and Level 3 Certificate in Counselling Studies or their equivalent. Candidates are required to have completed tutor observed Person-Centred skills sessions.

Interview – applicants need to be able to demonstrate their ability to handle the level of academic work required and show a willingness to take responsibility for oneself. An enhanced DBS is required. The two day residential is mandatory and not included in the fees.

Progression

Successful completion of this course will allow you to apply for higher level qualifications. Please be aware that if your long term goal is to work in an area with vulnerable adults or any person under the age of 18, further training will be required and it will be necessary to undergo a disclosure and barring services (DBS) check at your place of employment. If you have a criminal conviction this may exclude you from working in some job roles.

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Funding

Please note that there will also be a mandatory two day residential trip (with overnight stay) during the course which promises to be a very valuable learning and personal development experience. This is an additional cost of approximately £250.

The course requires you to undergo a minimum of 10 Person-Centred Personal Counselling sessions, along with monthly supervision (once out on placement), these are additional costs that will have to be covered by yourself.

To fund this course, you have the option to apply for an Advanced Learner Loan to cover your fees, subject to eligibility criteria. The course fee does not include BACP membership. You could also either pay in three instalments or pay the fee in full.
