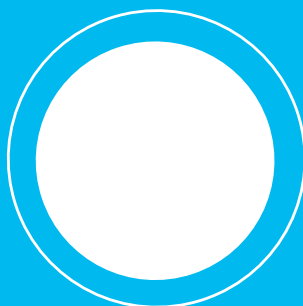

EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS

Our Additional Learning Support (ALS) department is available to you if you have special educational needs (SEND). ALS can create an individualised support plan for you to inform your teaching staff. This will identify strategies that will support you, to help remove barriers to your learning and achievement, and support your independence.

All students with SEND may choose to work quietly in the ALS department in study periods and access support from our Education Support Workers (ESWs). The ALS team can also give you guidance on the use of assistive technology and your eligibility for exam access arrangements.

Students may also be able to access support with the development of social and emotional skills, independent living skills and preparation for adulthood; life beyond college, whilst the ALS team can also help to signpost you to other support services across college. Transition support from high school to college is available, please contact us for further information.

If you have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP), you can access an enhanced transition to college life which can include additional visits and access to our Bridging days. Once enrolled, you will have your own Key Worker in the ALS team. A personalised support package will be agreed for you, in line with your outcomes, this could include both in and out of class support from the ESW team and additional literacy and numeracy support.

Please help us, to help you. It is important that you declare any additional needs or previous exam access arrangements. This could include for example if you were given extra time in your exams, or had someone to read for you. Please let us know as soon as possible so that we can make sure you get the right support. 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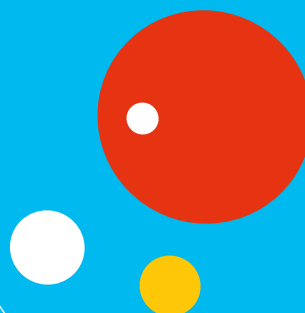
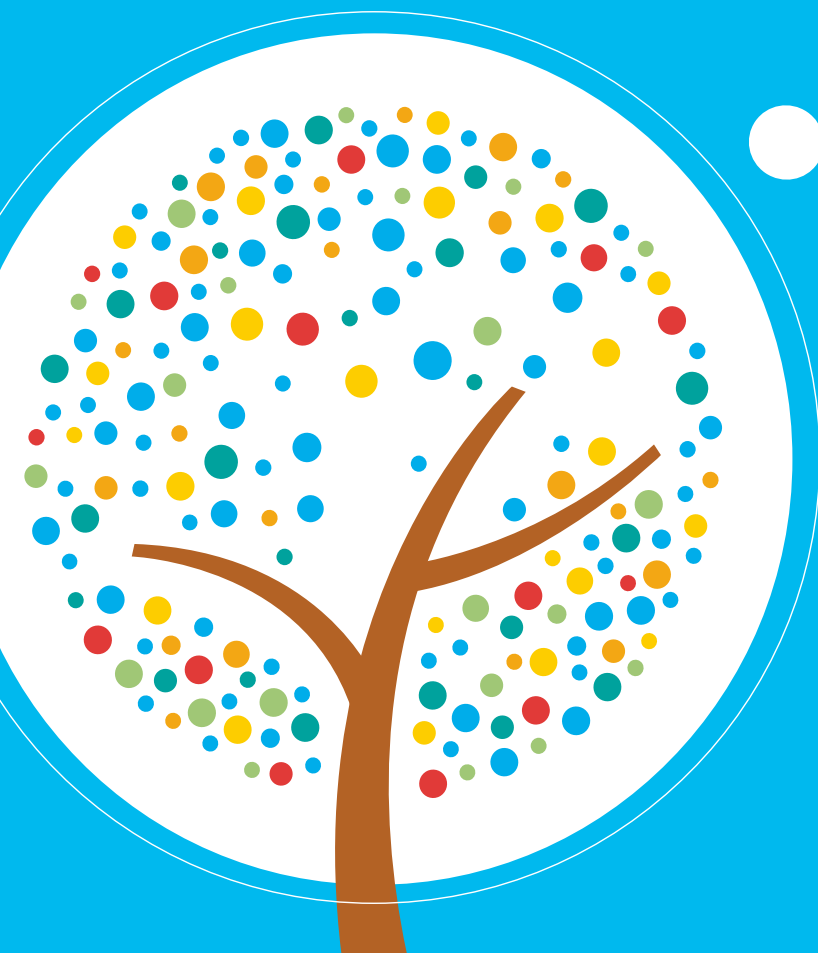

A LEVEL BUSINESS

Why should I come to Runshaw to study Business?

Business at Runshaw offers a unique, practical edge that applies to a wide range of industries. Our students consistently surpass national benchmarks, thanks to our highly experienced teachers who are also external examiners. You will benefit from superb enrichment programmes, practical activities, workshops, and guest speakers, refining your business skills and making you attractive to employers. Our annual Business Futures Week event, featuring over 25 guest speakers, provides invaluable insights and networking opportunities.

What will I study?

In the first year, you will explore various business contexts, from large corporations to small enterprises, both in the UK and globally. You will focus on key functional areas such as Marketing, Operations, Human Resources, and Finance, as well as the fundamentals of business setup and management. In Year 2, the emphasis shifts to strategic decision-making at the highest levels of management, considering the impact of the external environment, strategies for growth, leadership, planning, managing change, and understanding why strategies sometimes fail.

The course is assessed through three written examinations at the end of Year 2, covering the entire specification.

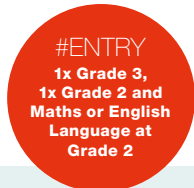

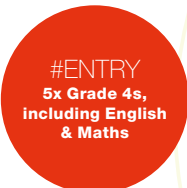

The Level 3 Advanced IT course is aimed at students with a passion for technology, who want to develop practical, industry relevant skills and are aiming to build a career in the digital and computing sectors.

What will I study?

This dynamic course builds the technical and professional skills needed for success in the digital sector. You will gain experience with Excel, Access, and project management tools, whilst learning to code using HTML, CSS, and Python. You will explore key areas, including

data analysis, digital design, and digital marketing through social media, content creation, and analytics. This leads on for you to study cybersecurity, IT tech support, and IT management, learning how to protect systems, support users, and understand how IT is managed in organisations. The course also covers enterprise in IT, showing how technology drives innovation and business growth. As part of the course, you will complete a two-week work placement and take part in employability skills sessions to help prepare you for the world of work. This qualification provides a strong foundation for university, apprenticeships, or employment in a wide range of IT roles.

Why should I come to Runshaw to study T Level Digital Production, Design & Development?

This course is perfect for students aiming to excel in the digital industry, combining high-quality classroom learning with practical industry skills, preparing you for a dynamic career. You will gain comprehensive knowledge and hands-on experience, making you well-equipped for future opportunities in digital production, design, and development.

What will I study?

In Year 1, we cover essential topics such as business context, culture (including ethical and moral issues), data management and modelling, digital analysis and environment, and software and hardware testing. These foundational subjects will give you a solid understanding of the digital industry. Year 2 then specialises in Digital Production, Design and Development, achieving 'Threshold Competence' in this area. You will learn to design, implement, and test software, change, maintain, and support software, and apply ethical principles while managing risks in software development. The course includes a substantial Industry Placement (minimum 45 days/315 hours), providing you with valuable real-world experience and enhancing your employability.

Why should I come to Runshaw to study Applied Professionals in Engineering?

Our Level 2/3 Applied Professionals in Engineering courses are exciting, technically challenging, and wide-ranging, preparing you for amazing career opportunities in the industry. You will benefit from guest speakers from national and international engineering companies like Cadent Gas and Robertson, as well as local firms. The programme includes annual residential trips to places like London, Design Your Future showcases, and team-building events.

What will I study?

You will gain a strong understanding of engineering through a one-year transition programme, then choose either an L2 BTEC or a L3 Advanced Programme in Engineering for two years, equivalent to 3 A Levels. You will develop skills in Engineering Design, Engineering Mathematics, and Computer-Aided Design. The Engineering Maintenance unit builds practical skills essential for progression. Maths and English GCSEs can also be studied if needed to boost progression. A structured work placement offers real industry experience via a day-release calendar, preparing you for the job market.

Entry Requirements - General

For our A Level Programme our entry requirements are a minimum of 5x Grade 5, including Maths and English.

For our Advanced Vocational courses our entry requirements are a minimum of 5x Grade 4, including either Maths or English Language at Grade 4 or above, and no less than a Grade 3 in the other.

For our pre-Advanced courses our offer is usually a minimum of 4x Grade 3, including English and Maths.

Please note that any student not achieving a Grade 4 in GCSE Maths/English Language will resit these GCSEs alongside their main college course.

Specific Courses/ Subjects

Please note that some courses and subjects will have additional specific entry requirements or require DBS clearance to undertake placements. Information about this can be found on the Apply Portal and on your offer letter which you will receive after your interview.

**Please note that the following A Level subjects require a Grade 6 in English and/or Languages and/ or Maths and/or Science: English, Maths, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, French, Spanish, EPQ.*

- Where applicants have complex or profound needs, a special Admissions Assessment will be undertaken to consider whether the college can offer suitable curriculum and support for the young person
- disclose any criminal conviction

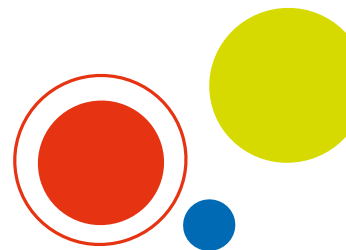

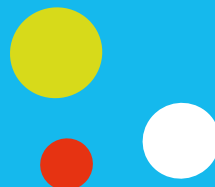
